FYI and Clarification

There is a new Dedicated Fund, Youth Facilities Fund.

An explanation and information: Over the past at least five years we have tried to improve or enlarge the youth meeting space. Each time it just died because there was no drive behind it. Now there are several people who are working on getting something concrete to work on. They have been busy reaching out and securing bids, meeting with city inspectors more than once to put together an affordable plan that will increase the capacity of the youth meeting space. Also providing a bathroom for their space, and also the plan is to increase the size by adding a 12x40 foot area to accommodate the growing attendance we are experiencing. Plus, as stated, putting in a bathroom which is very necessary. The biggest expense is getting running water to the shed plus a sewer line. There is an acceptable bid we are considering. Once we have all the answers this will have to be voted on by the church. Originally we will be seeking Phase One, the plumbing. This is roughly \$25,000. The entire completed project will be under \$50,000. Please be in prayer. If you're led to contribute before the end of the year for tax purposes, mark it for this dedicated fund. Thank you.



Finance Committee Report For November 2025

On the chart below, I have the finance figures for October and November. Our income for November, \$28,163, was the highest of any month so far in 2025 and resulted in a positive difference of \$1,677. The average income for 2025 so far is \$22,963. which is below the average amount needed to fulfill our budget, \$27,247. It is the Holiday season and many of us are traveling to visit families. I encourage everyone to "make up" any missed offerings on the Sunday's you will be here or give online. Also keep in mind the church in any "end of year" giving plans you have. There are some tax changes coming in 2026 that make it financially advantageous to give in 2025 rather than in 2026 for some tax brackets.

The Finance Committee has worked hard to balance our church's budget against the challenge of decreasing income and increasing expenses. Please pray for the Finance Committee to have discernment and wisdom as we consider our Church's finances.

New Designated Fund: The Deacons and the Finance Committee have set up a new designated fund, the "Youth Facilities Fund" that may be used for any improvement to a youth meeting area. Contributions to it should be noted on your check or offering envelope.
